Public Speaking

GENE GLEASON introduced our speaker of the morning, John Staley. John is the founding director of the Lawyer's Performance Lab, which instructs attorneys in the finer arts of public speaking. He came to give us a short course in how to speak before groups. He noted that the main point that must be made is that the speaker knows his or her subject. He called that the "Authenticity" of the speaker. Body language is the second point with voice delivery being the third.

In talking of body language, he noted that the hands and gestures must fit the size of the audience. If you are speaking to a thousand people you must be more visibly demonstrative than if you are speaking to a small group. Make eye contact with all of your audience; do not concentrate on just one group.

You should have vocal variety. Loudness, sufficient for the audience to hear, is important. Variety of delivery and not a monotone is necessary. Know your audience. He compared the delivery a coach would use in talking to his football team versus the gentleness necessary when talking to a three year old.

It is necessary to blank out distractions so as to keep focus on your subject. Be prepared but do not memorize your talk. A lost sentence of delivery can lead to disaster if you have only memorized the speech.

He asked for volunteers to come forward and say a sentence or so about any subject. He would then critique their few words and ask them to repeat them. GERALD PEEBLER and Christian Recinos volunteered to be guinea pigs. The bulk of the critique centered around making eye contact with everyone in the room.

John mentioned that vocal rhythm is important. For those on stage or in films, voice is 90% of acting. He talked about varying pitch and loudness.

At the same time I was drafted by Uncle Sam to play on his team. (Guess which one got preference.)

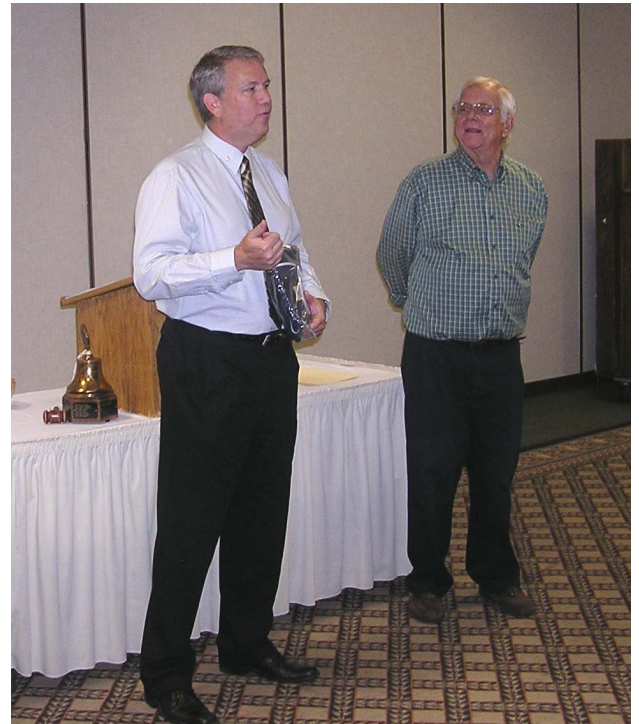
At one time I had a contracting company that installed Christmas decorations for nearby cities.

The Objects of Kiwanis International

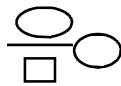
To give primacy to the human and spiritual, rather than to the material values of life
